Our Tradition to Connect the Good in our Communities

Every April, we celebrate two anniversaries: the opening of the first Wawa store in 1964 and the launch of The Wawa Foundation in 2014. When Grahame Wood opened the first Wawa store in 1964, he had a vision of a place that not only served customers, but that gave back to its community. Through the years, our associates began finding ways Wawa could help our communities that were extensions of what Wawa does naturally by helping care for neighbors, supporting hunger relief efforts by ensuring the availability of nutritious food, serving those who serve others, and being reliable and accessible when the community calls. In 2014, on Wawa's 50th anniversary, that same legacy of giving was formalized and amplified with the establishment of The Wawa Foundation, entrusted with building stronger communities by continuing that legacy of care focused on: health, hunger and everyday heroes.

Now, nine years later, Wawa and The Wawa Foundation have contributed more than \$136.0 million in financial and in-kind support to more than 6,000 community partners focused on health, hunger and everyday heroes across our entire geographical footprint. In addition, more than 30.0 million meals have been donated by Wawa stores to local food pantries through the Wawa Share food donation program.

For the year 2022, support from Wawa and The Wawa Foundation provided more than \$22.2 million in financial grants to national and local charity partners, 3.6 million pounds of food to local food pantries, \$4.0 million in in-kind support, and more than \$1.0 million in hurricane relief support to Florida communities that were impacted by Hurricanes Ian. In addition, Wawa associates supported nearly 100 local community events, including assembling and shipping more than 15,000 care packages to deployed service members in coordination with the U.S.O. through our "Taste of Home" initiative. As part of these local events, the Wawa Community Care Beverage vans served more than 25,000 cups of coffee, hot chocolate and other beverages during Polar Plunges®, JDRF One Walks and LLS Light the Night events to support those serving others.

We are committed to being a positive force for good in every community where we live and work – not just with donations, but also heartfelt actions and commitments and positive interactions that bring out the best in everyone. We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of our wonderful customers who support our in-store campaigns, and we are also so proud of our associates who help deliver our mission both in our stores and side-by-side supporting friends and neighbors at events.

This year, we are sharing local giving highlights in every Wawa store, and we will celebrate our amazing Wawa Volunteer Force with a special social media collection of associate volunteers available during April.

We look forward to continuing our commitment to building stronger communities and to connecting and amplifying the good that abounds

in every neighborhood we serve.



2022 Financial Highlights

In 2022, financial grants were made by The Wawa Foundation to more than 2,000 non-profit organizations, including our seven National Partners. The funds come from donations by Wawa, Inc., its associates and from the generous donations by Wawa customers through our in-store campaigns. Approximately half of the collections from in-store campaigns benefit The Wawa Foundation's National Partners and the remaining collections support local and regional non-profit organizations in every community Wawa serves. Wawa associates from each region serve as Regional Representatives for The Wawa Foundation to help select and determine local and regional non-profit organizations receiving grants. The Wawa Foundation is fully committed to ensuring that 100% of all funds donated go directly to non-profits. Nearly all administrative expenses are covered by Wawa, Inc.

Recognizing a Legacy of Care

Jay Culotta served as Chair of The Wawa Foundation Board since its inception in 2014, creating a strong base and governance structure that has driven many important milestones of giving as well as positioned the team for success well into the future.

In addition to his steadfast passion and commitment to The Wawa Foundation and our initiatives, Jay has a personal commitment to fundraising for Kennedy Krieger Institute, which is part Johns Hopkins Hospital, during his annual

Run for Hannah. Jay has dedicated his "Run For Hannah" every year to his daughter, Hannah Rose, raising funds for the Kennedy Krieger Institute at

Johns Hopkins. The mission of Kennedy Krieger is "to help all patients with Down syndrome reach their full potential and function as independently as possible in family, school and community life." Since 1996, Jay has raised \$745,000, of

which \$56,096 was raised in 2022. In honor of his legacy of service, The Wawa Foundation and Kennedy Krieger Institute have launched the Hannah Rose Culotta Endowed Research Fund to support important research in care and services for patients with Down syndrome.

With his retirement, Maria Kalogredis, Senior Director of Legal and Deputy General Counsel for Wawa serves as Board Chair, and Liz Simeone, Senior Manager of The Wawa Foundation & Community Care serves as President. Jay will continue serving in an Emeritus role and sharing the story of The Wawa Foundation as only he can.

Highlights of Support

In-Store Campaigns: Despite another challenging year, our in-store campaigns continue to be successful and have a tremendous impact on our National Partners' ability to provide their services to communities we serve.

Direct Financial Grants: For the year 2022, The Wawa Foundation has distributed more than \$10 million in grants to non-profit organizations providing services in our focus areas throughout communities across our footprint.

Community Care & Volunteering: Community Care events and donations are funded by Wawa and intended to reach local, grass roots community organizations helping to connect our associates with their communities. In 2022, this support included in-kind product donations totaling more than \$2.5 million; on the ground support of events including coffee, beverages and snacks valued at more than \$1.3 million; and associate engagement through volunteerism at walks and fundraisers hosted by The Wawa Foundation partners.






The Wawa Volunteer Center At The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP):






