In 2014, on Wawa's 50th anniversary, our CEO Chris Gheysens formally recognized this founding legacy of community commitment and service by establishing of The Wawa Foundation. Today, with support from thousands of non-profit partners and millions of customers and associates, The Wawa Foundation proudly champions life-saving health-related research and care, leads hunger relief efforts, and supports many of the heroes making a difference in our communities every day. Non-profit proposals are considered at the most local level to ensure we fund critical programs that serve local communities around our stores. In addition, we have fostered strong relationships with seven National Partners that deliver transformational programs and services that impact lives across our communities.

As we reach our 10th anniversary, we are incredibly proud to say that Wawa and The Wawa Foundation have contributed close to \$160 million to support meaningful partners and programs in these focus areas. Thanks to the generosity of our extended flock – our customers and associates – we are able to support more than 6,500 non-profit partners annually with financial grants, in-kind support and volunteerism.

Our mission to build stronger communities can be seen and measured by the impact our non-profit partners have had throughout our communities. Over the past decade, we have seen incredible results, which include everything from the millions of lives served through meaningful support provided by the amazing efforts of our National Partners to

Adjusting to life with Type One diabetes (T1D) can be overwhelming. There is so much to learn, new ways to plan, and plenty of new items to add to a person's to-do list. Wawa and The Wawa Foundation made the journey a little bit easier. Pediatric Acute Leukemia (PedAL) Master Clinical Trial: LLS launched the LLS PedAL Master Clinical Trial, testing new, safer treatments for kids based on their unique tumor biology. PedAL opened over 175 screening trial sites and more than 65 treatment trial sites globally thanks to support from partners like Wawa.

LLS Clinical Trial Support: Because of support from partners like Wawa, LLS can staff Clinical Trial Nurse Navigators who increase patients' opportunities for clinical trial participation by facilitating informed decision-making and minimizing logistical barriers for the patient and family.

Looking Ahead: Connecting the Good in More Ways

As we reflect on this milestone year for Wawa and The Wawa Foundation, we look forward to the next decade and know that, with the support of our dedicated associates and customers, we will be able to fulfill more lives than ever before. Here are highlights of some programs we are most excited about in 2024.

• Flying to New Markets

With every new store we open, we aim to weave ourselves into the fabric of the community – becoming a true asset that supports and fulfills lives. The Wawa Foundation continues to grow and expand support to the new and adjacent markets Wawa is beginning to serve, often before we break ground on our new store locations. Working with our National Partners, The Foundation team connects with local and regional chapters to tour, listen and learn about the priorities and needs of our new communities. During **Community Partnership Day** events, Foundation representatives and Wawa associates have hosted local events that have included building care packages to be sent to deployed service members, packing food boxes to be distributed to local families in need, serving coffee to nurses and staff at local hospitals, and hosting a cornhole tournament with Special Olympics athletes, to name a few. The Foundation has already awarded the first grants in the region to launch our official commitment to fulfilling lives and building stronger communities in our new markets.



• Fly Beyond Signature Initiatives

Launched in 2023, Wawa's Fly Beyond® programs are an initiative of Wawa and The Wawa Foundation to fight food insecurity and reduce hunger at the community level. These programs are designed to inspire goodness and increase access to fresh, nutritious food and healthy meals for underserved youth. Over the next five years, Wawa and The Wawa Foundation are aiming to make more than 60 million fresh, nutritious meals available to children across Wawa's service area through Fly Beyond. In the end, the goal of Fly Beyond is not just to meet the incredible need for



healthy, nutritious food among underserved youth, but to help young people “fly beyond” and thrive through better nutrition. In 2024, Fly Beyond consists of three programs: **Key Issue Grants** providing \$1 million in funding to Check-Out Hunger food bank partners; **Buy a Kids Meal, Make an Impact** providing a donation of 0.33 cents for every Kids Meal sold to a local food bank partner, which is the equivalent of one meal; **Second Harvest Partnership**, our initial Fly Beyond pilot, will continue to expand to serve more than 53,000 households in the greater Orlando, Florida, market through dedicated Fly Beyond school pantry markets and weekend meal bags containing fresh produce.

• Helping Hands Community Care Challenge

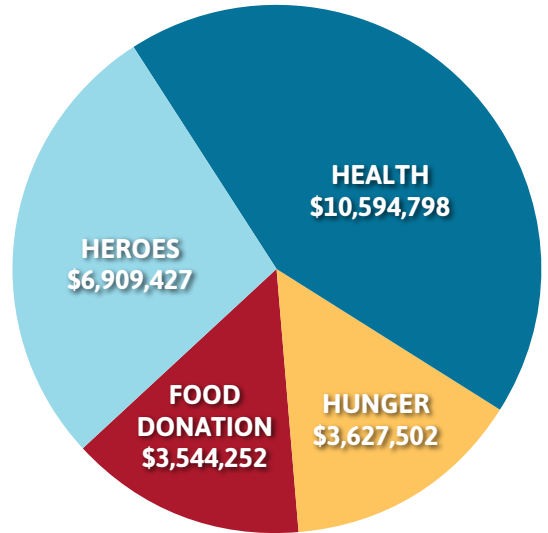
Wawa, The Wawa Foundation and Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) will launch the inaugural **Helping Hands Community Care Challenge** on September 13, 2024. The day-long event will bring together hundreds of representatives from local companies who will participate in various volunteer programs benefiting patients and families at CHOP. CHOP and Wawa's long-standing relationship dates back to 1855, and both organizations share a commitment to compassionate care for children, an emphasis on serving the entire family and a belief that volunteerism can change communities. The purpose of this event is to bring together the corporate community for a day of shared impact, as it takes a team to heal a child – and volunteers are an essential part of that team. The Wawa Coffee & Care Cart will be onsite as an example of a volunteer activity at CHOP. Attendees will also have the chance to register for future volunteer opportunities. From delivering coffee and beverages to patients and families at CHOP to the small, but day-brightening moments that take place thousands of times a day in our Wawa stores, we are grateful for the chance to share the incredible impact that kindness, service and volunteering can have on everyone involved.



2023 Financial Highlights

In 2023, financial grants were made by The Wawa Foundation to more than 3,500 non-profit organizations, including our seven National Partners. The funds come from donations by Wawa, Inc., its associates and from the generous donations by Wawa customers through our in-store campaigns. Approximately half of the collections from in-store campaigns benefit The Wawa Foundation's National Partners and the remaining collections support local and regional non-profit organizations in every community Wawa serves. Wawa associates from each region serve as Regional Representatives for The Wawa Foundation to help select and determine local and regional non-profit organizations receiving grants. The Wawa Foundation is fully committed to ensuring that 100% of all funds donated go directly to non-profits. Nearly all administrative expenses are covered by Wawa, Inc.

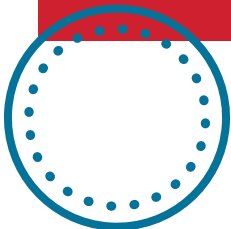
